You may have noticed the fantastic EARTH MOTHER sculpture emerging from the Ramsey Park turf near the new water fountain and the swings. Earth Mother's creator, EYULIYA LANINA, will be on hand from 10 am to noon to share her work with the community.



Ms. Lanina's Earth Mother sculpture symbolizes fertility and motherhood, motifs that appear often in mythology. The artist's dedication to the earth is illustrated as a large, whimsical female head that emerges from the earth and engenders awareness and respect for the natural world. The piece reminds us that as Mother Earth cares for us, we also care for her. Earth Mother will be on display at Ramsey Park until November 30.

Earth Mother is a project of the City of Austin's Art in Public Places' TEMPO program, which allows artists to explore a range of themes suitable for the outdoor environment and provides the opportunity for innovative, thought-provoking artwork that impacts the way people experience their environment, will also be on hand to discuss the program. So come meet the artist and learn more about Austin Art in Public Places and all 10 TEMPO projects from 10:00 am to noon on November 21st.

GAP Letter to the Austin City Council

Dear Members of the Austin City Council,

The Great Austin Parks (GAP) coalition is an alliance of park advocates and organizations united to speak with one voice about the importance of parks and open space in Austin.

As members of the GAP coalition, we urge you to support the proposed changes to the Parkland Dedication Ordinance. Austin continues to be one of the fastest growing cities in the nation, yet our parkland fees rank among the lowest. Because the existing code will not allow Austin to maintain the current level of service as our city grows, we ask you to support the proposed changes. These changes will help us begin to achieve our shared Imagine Austin goals of increased recreation and open space by increasing our parkland level of service from 5 acres to 9.4 acres per 1000 people. Now is the time to increase these fees.

We cannot continue to postpone this change until it is perfect. If we do not pass this ordinance, we risk putting our parks system and Austin's quality of life in jeopardy.

While we support the proposed changes, we recognize this ordinance still needs work, as it only allows us to maintain the existing level of parkland and park amenities. While it is a good start, we believe that Austin deserves more, and we strongly encourage city council to continue working toward a more robust Parkland Dedication ordinance—one that will allow for an increasingly higher level of service. In addition, we believe the process by which Parkland Dedication funds are spent should continue to be made more transparent and also include stakeholder input. There is still work to be done.

In addition, we are cognizant of the urgent need to further diversify the funding structure for our park system. We recommend that you task the Parks and Recreation Board with researching alternative revenue sources and funding models to support our parks. On behalf of the many organizations that are leveraging millions of private dollars, and tens of thousands of volunteers annually for our parks system, we strongly urge you to update our Parkland Dedication Ordinance. The time is now.
